

Ukrainian Society 1994–2004: Sociological Monitoring

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This publication presents comparative data from eleven national public opinion polls conducted between 1994 and 2004 by the Institute of Sociology (National Academy of Sciences of Ukraine) with the assistance of the Democratic Initiatives Foundation and the Socis Center for Social and Political Research. The publication tracks the changes that have occurred in public opinion concerning a variety of social issues in Ukraine.

This publication is intended for scholars, journalists, public policy professionals and others interested in the social changes occurring in Ukraine.

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Preface

This publication contains comparative data from eleven nationwide public opinion polls conducted between 1994 and 2004. These polls are a component of the “Ukrainian Society on the threshold of the XXI century” project of the Institute of Sociology, National Academy of Science of Ukraine. Democratic Initiatives Foundation and the Socis Center were also partly involved in this project.

The project monitors the current state and perspectives for the development of Ukrainian society, its structures and institutions, economic, political and cultural characteristics as reflected in public opinion, the psychological state, social manners and orientation of various categories of Ukraine’s population. The regular study of public opinion facilitates the tracking of changes in social values and to determine the stability or volatility of specific issues in public opinion. The Director of the project is Professor V. Vorona, the Executive Directors and Researchers are Dr. N. Panina and Dr. E. Holovakha.

The sampling design was developed by N. Panina and M. Churylov (Socis). The Socis Center completed the field work.

The polls were conducted at the end of May — beginning of June in 1994, 1995, 1996, 1997, 1998, 1999; and at the end of January — beginning of February in 2000, 2001, 2002, 2003, 2004. The samples represent the adult population of Ukraine (over the age of 18) and include all of Ukraine’s oblasts and the Autonomous Republic of Crimea. In 1994, 1,807 people were polled, 1995 — 1,810, 1996 — 1,800, 1997 — 1,800, 1998 — 1,810, 1999 — 1,810, 2000 — 1,810, 2001 — 1,800, 2002 — 1,799, 2003 — 1,800, 2004 — 1,800. Each oblast is represented by a proportional number of the adult population. The sample represents the adult population of Ukraine according to sex, age, ethnicity and type of community (city, town, village). The “sampling error” does not exceed 2.34%.

From 1994 to 1995, the polls were sponsored by the Eurasia Foundation, the International Renaissance Foundation and by the Socis Center — 1996–1998. From 1999 to 2004, the empirical component of the project was sponsored by the Institute of Sociology, National Academy of Sciences of Ukraine.

Methodology and Research Design

The Institute of Sociology of Ukraine of the National Academy of Sciences has conducted annual empiric research of peculiarities of Ukrainian society development for more than ten years.

Within the framework of the project, a system of sociological indices has been developed that helps us to trace tendencies of social changes basing on the study of public opinion and public awareness (value orientations, social aims, opinions and estimations of society's state and its perspectives).

The main goal of the project is to trace, and analyze changes in social system as a whole as well as in separate spheres of social life.

Principles of Forming the Social indicators System

Given the fact, that Ukraine after the declaration of its independency defined democratic way of development (building an open society with market economy and democratic bases of organization of political life) as a main goal of social and political changes, development of indices was based upon paradigm of *democratization development in Ukraine*.

In accordance with the main goal of the research — analysis of social changes tendencies — general demands to form an aggregate of empiric indices were defined. First of all, every index has to reflect a characteristic of social system state, directly or indirectly. Secondly, changes by the indices, fixed by monitoring, are to be measured by indicators, enabling us to assess character and direction of changes of social system in the “democratization” vector.

One of the main principles in selection of social indices of Ukrainian society's state is *ability to estimate the level of realization of democratic changes in Ukraine (in economical, political, legal, social, and other life spheres) with a corresponding index*.

Because democratic changes are not the end in itself but universally recognized socio-political mechanism of enhancing level and quality of people's life, the second important principle of forming the system of indices is *ability to estimate dynamics of well-being level of population* (economical, political and legal, moral, psychological and physical) with the above mentioned index.

Efficacy of society's democratization processes is to be assessed by generally recognized criteria of efficiency of the three main constituents of strategy of reforming in the society and the state:

- *efficiency of economic policy* that is to be measured by level of society's support of socio-economic reforms, increasing living standards of people and widening of their possibilities to realize their labor potential;
- *efficiency of political system changes* that is reflected in support of political reforms and democratically chosen state authorities on the basis of strengthening democratic rights and freedoms, legality, law and order, political stability, international and confessional agreements in the state;
- *efficiency of social policy* that is directly measured by improvement of social situation, psychological and physical health of people on the basis of broadened access to comforts of modern civilization in main realms of life.

Structure and Types of Social Indices

Taking into account the fact that successfulness of democratic changes significantly depends on mass population support of democratic principles of organization of social system, emotional and psychological components of mass awareness, connected with peculiarities of social changes a lot of attention was paid to the system of indices.

To show state and dynamics of mass awareness to the fullest extend, indices (questions of questionnaire) were used as instruments enabling us to make conclusions not only on declarative purposes and factological self-reports of a person but also on emotional and rational evaluations.

Balance of factological and emotionally evaluative indicators in accordance with their typology suggested by Y. Golovakha, were taking into account by changing the proposed indices into concrete measurement indicators.

Declaratively aimed statements reflects person's readiness to act in this or that way in certain social circumstances (readiness to social protest, migration, support of certain political forces etc). Aggregate of this category indices reflects peculiarities of declarative level of mass awareness in its emotional, rational and aimed-behavioral components. Taking into account phenomena of non-identity of declared opinions' contents and realities of social life of the people, the authors of the project paid special attention to the category of indices reflecting facts and events of person's life, biography, material and behavioral realities of their everyday life.

Factological statements fix presence of life events (circumstances) and reflect concrete life conditions and forms of people's activities. The last group of indices is fully presented in blocks of questions concerning people's life areas connected to efficacy evaluation of economical and social policies.

Rationally-evaluative statements ("right-wrong", "corresponding opinion, non-corresponding opinion"). As to this type of indices, the project authors focused their attention on opinions on rationality and relevance to certain political decisions and acts in different spheres of social life. We talk here about indices characterizing the level of declared support and an accep-

tance of different directions in social development (e.g. support or disapproval of necessity of privatization, institute of multi-party system etc).

Emotionally-evaluative statements enable a person to express a general positive, negative or neutral assessing information concerning a subject of research (with such categories as “good-bad”, “better-worse”); estimations of trust and satisfaction belong to this category of opinions as well. As experience of the first polls (1992, 1994) proved fact that in transitional society emotionally-evaluative statements are characterized by high (often inadequate) level of declared negativism and pessimism, starting from 1995 research instruments (question list) was added with questions presupposing answers reflecting estimation of presence or absence of certain social goods (correspondingly “a scale of social goods sufficiency” was used; “enough — not enough — not-interested”).

Structure of questionnaires contains thematic blocks of indicators characterizing peculiarities of democratization process in different life realms:

- Economical situation
- Political situation
- Social situation
- Social well-being
- Health
- Social interactions
- Local conditions
- Language situation
- Information space
- Free time
- Dwelling
- Family welfare standards
- Employment
- Education

- Family

About the History of Monitoring Project Development

The first step to elaboration of the monitoring project was the research “Social well-being and psychological state of Ukrainian population” conducted by N.Panina in 1992. Within the project frameworks the first variant of questionnaire design and instrumentation was developed. After analyzing of the received material was completed (together with Y. Golovakha) and used as a basis for further work.

In 1994, Institute of Sociology of National Academy of Sciences of Ukraine started realization of the project of annual monitoring “Ukrainian society on the threshold of XXI century” initiated and managed by V. Vorona, Director of the Institute of Sociology of National Academy of Sciences of Ukraine (N. Panina and Y. Golovakha — the program developers).

In 1998, the Institute of Sociology of National Academy of Sciences of Ukraine started cooperation with Russian Center of Public Opinion Studying (Director — Y. Levada) with the

aim of broadening empiric basis for possibilities of comparative analysis in Ukraine and Russia. Within the frameworks of this cooperation the monitoring questionnaire design was added with a number of indices from monitoring of Russian Center of Public Opinion Studying (Levada-Center now).

Monitoring researches have a specific character. The authors face the dilemma what to do in case when wording of a question appears to be not the best or when a certain part of answers becomes antiquated because of socio-political changes. On one hand, if to change wording of a question or answers scale, it will be incorrect to compare the received material with preliminary data; part of received information is lost in the monitoring contest. In case of not making changes, the researches deliberately agree with receiving non-perfect information. After all, there comes a moment when it is reasonable to review questionnaire design and to make necessary corrections defined during the period of monitoring conducting.

Therefore, in 2002 the project management made a decision to reform the system of indices. Almost all representatives of all departments of Institute of Sociology of National Academy of Sciences of Ukraine were involved in development of the renewed system of social indices. The project was entitled as “Ukrainian society: monitoring of social changes”.

Questionnaire of the year 2002 keeps consecution with the previous phase. At the same time, the number of social life realms was widened as well as number of indices. Research of 2002 may be called exploring, as new indices had to be tested first before been selected for monitoring as most informative for targeting the main goal of the project.

The perspective program of the project was meant from the very beginning to have two research phases of social changes. The first phase was monitoring of Ukrainian society's state *by basic indices* referring to different realms of people's life. After the defined period (when one can suppose that the basic indices reflect objectively the society's state and its dynamics), the second project phase was started. The main goal of the second phase was extended research of certain life realms. On the second phase, the monitoring indices were supplemented with different additional indicators enabling us to more profoundly analyzed reasons, factors, consequences, and perspectives of ongoing processes and phenomena in different spheres of the social life.

Sample and Peculiarities in the Data Collection

The national sample was developed N. Panina, M. Churylov for implementing empiric part of the project in 1992. The sample size covered 1800 persons representing adult population of Ukraine (18-years aged and older) by sex, age, education, type of settling and regions.

By its type, the sample was stratificated, random (with quote screening on the last stage). On the first stage, selection of the localities (interrogation centers) was executed, on the second — selection of addresses (route starting-points), on the third - selection of respondents.

The first selection stage was conducted in accordance with the previous stratification of Ukrainian localities. Main stratification parameters were administrative and territorial division of Ukraine (24 regions and Autonomous republic of Crimea) and type of settlement (city — village). With the aim of lessening the number of strata, oblasts were grouped in regions taking into account proximity of a number of values of socio-demographic, socio-economical, socio-cultural indices (by state and departmental statistics data), socio-political indices (by presidential and parliamentary elections data), as well as by public polls data conducted by

“Socis”. The procedure was executed by consecutive use of factor and cluster data analyses by 120 indices. As a result, 25 oblasts were grouped into 10 regions. Urban population of every region was stratified in accordance with parameters of administrative status and city size: 1) oblast centers; 2) big cities (with more than 200 000 population) and average cities (with more than 50 000 population); 3) small towns and urban villages. Rural localities in this stratification were adjoined to the cities the localities are administratively subjected to. As a result we have 30 strata ($3 \times 10 = 30$).

From the first-type strata — “oblast centers” — entire selection of cities was implemented— (so that the sample contained all oblast centers). From the strata of the second and third type, random selection by lists of cities ranged by population number was made. Selection of villages was made at random from lists of villages administratively subjected to cities (urban villages) been selected for random sample. As a result, there were 113 interrogation centers formed (69 cities and 44 villages).

Quantitative distribution of 1800 persons by strata was calculated by population census data of 1989. The following data was taking into account: population distribution by oblasts; population distribution by “city-village” type in every oblast; additional calculations enabled us to define proportions between oblast center inhabitants and inhabitants of other types of cities.

Mentioned above approach enabled us to further regrouping of the oblasts with the aim of specifying regional peculiarities of public opinion concerning different issues avoiding significant losses in representing regions of any configuration.

On the second stage, consideration was given to the households. In every inhabited locality streets were previously stratificated by segments (“age” of microdistricts and their remoteness from the center are segment parameters). From every stratum random selection of street (from street list) and building number (from 1 to 6 by dice playing) for defining starting point of the route selection was made.

On the third stage, route method of addresses selection with consequent quote screening of respondents selection was implemented (Quotes by sex and age correspondingly with proportions of urban and rural population of every oblast are calculated by all-Union population census data from 1989).

For the monitoring period by using the developed sample were surveyed:

- May, 1992 — 1800 persons,
- May, 1994 — 1807 persons,
- May, 1995 — 1810 persons,
- May, 1996 — 1800 persons,
- May, 1997 — 1810 persons,
- May, 1998 — 1810 persons,
- May, 1999 — 1810 persons,
- January, 2000 — 1810 persons,
- January, 2001 — 1800 persons,
- February-March, 2002 — 1799 persons,
- February, 2003 — 1800 persons,
- February, 2004 — 1800 persons.

All polls were conducted by method of questionnaires distribution among respondents (for filling forms on their own) using national poll network of the Institute of Sociology of National Academy of Sciences of Ukraine and “Socis” Center.

Project Financing

The empiric part of the project in 1994–1995 was financed by Democratic Initiatives Center (Y.Golovaha — Research Director, I.Kucheriv — Executive Director, Research Expert — N.Panina). In 1996–1998 “Socis-Gellup” financed the project; in 1997 the poll was co-financed by the two above-mentioned organizations.

In 1999–2004 the empiric part of the project was fully financed by the Institute of Sociology of National Academy of Sciences of Ukraine.

Results Presenting

The presented informational materials contain results of eleven nationwide polls (1994–2004) generalized by fields of social life in blocks containing indicators reflecting relevant state and tendencies of Ukrainian society’s development in every social realm. Every table contains questions asked to respondents in the questionnaire; full set of answers variants, percentage distribution, and average value of index (simple average) in case, if the index was measured by interval or ordinal scale (conditionally interval scale).

It is worth mentioning that during the monitoring period, publications of corresponding information and analytical materials caused wide public resonance among politicians, political scientists, sociologists, lecturers, aspirants and students of sociology faculties, journalists and other mass media representatives. High schools lecturers use the data file for teaching students and aspirants; politicians — for parliamentary debates and in preparing law projects; journalists — for publication of thematic radio and TV programs; scientists (political scientists and sociologists) — for analysis of social life problems.
